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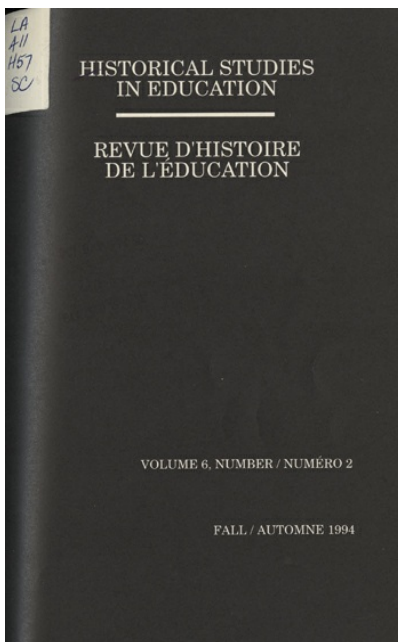

The volume's major contributions include the addition of women teachers' voices from the prairies and plains to the growing chorus of working women from other areas of the country and the inclusion of five intriguing case studies. The book is disappointing, however, in at least two respects. Although Cordier asserts that the women in her study both conformed to and challenged expectations of their gender, she fails to provide supporting evidence.
