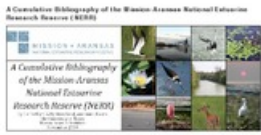

The United States Fish and Wildlife Service own the Aransas National Wildlife Refuge, including Matagorda Island, which contains beach, estuarine marsh, and non-tidal coastal plain habitat (66,216 acres). The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department manages the Goose Island State Park (271 acres), which is owned by the GLO.
